CONFERENCE PROTOCOL




GLCT MUN '23 conference typically has a code of conduct to ensure a respectful and productive environment for all participants. Here are some common guidelines that are often included:

- Report any form of Sexual Misconduct: Report any incidents promptly for immediate resolution.



NOTE: In all matters and disputes related to conference protocols and other relevant matters, it is to be noted that the final discretion and authority rests with the Organising Committee.






