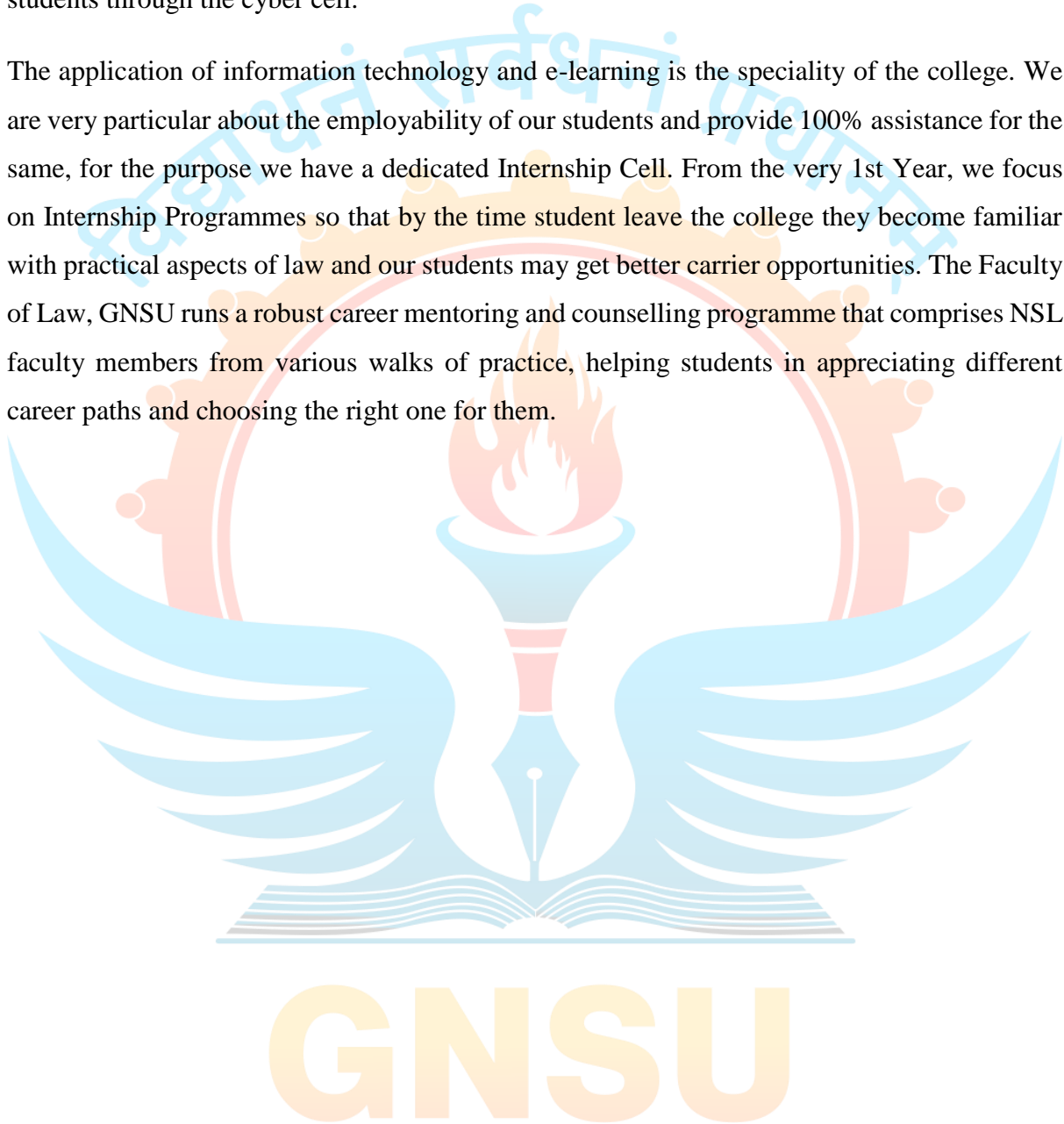
➤ **About Department of Law**

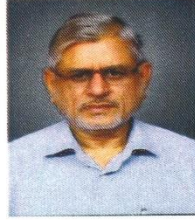

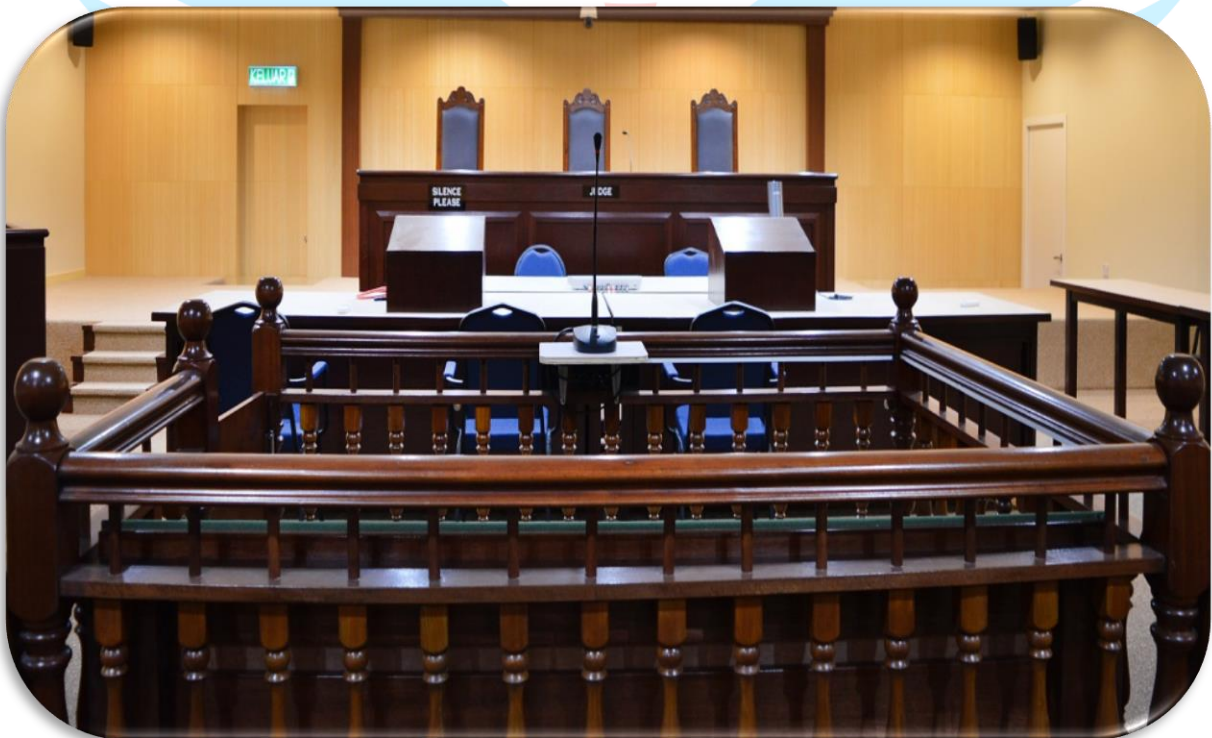

➤ About 3rd Deo Mangal Memorial National Moot Court Competition, 2024

The Narayan School of Law, Gopal Narayan Singh University is proud to announce the 3rd Deo Mangal Memorial National Moot Court Competition, 2024, which will take place in hybrid mode, combining both online and physical rounds. The competition is scheduled to commence with the Inauguration Ceremony on November 29, 2024, followed by the Preliminary Rounds on November 30, 2024, in online mode. The Quarter-Final and Semi-Final rounds will be held physically on the university campus on December 14, 2024, culminating in the Final Round on December 15, 2024. This competition aims to provide a platform for law students from across India to showcase their advocacy skills and engage in meaningful legal discourse. With the reputation built in the previous editions, we anticipate enthusiastic participation from leading law institutions.

The 3rd Deo Mangal Memorial National Moot Court Competition promises to be an intellectually stimulating event, judged by esteemed members of the judiciary and legal professionals. This competition serves as an excellent opportunity for students to refine their research, drafting and oral advocacy skills while competing in a challenging and prestigious environment



➤ Moot Proposition

Indaya, a vast and diverse nation, has long been hailed for its rich history, unique culture, and complex legal systems. Known for its vibrant traditions and deeply rooted sense of justice, Indaya has over time built a complex democratic framework that spans across its various states, each with its own distinct identity. Governed by a federal system, the country is home to 28 states and 8 Union Territories, with each state offering a unique blend of languages, customs, and governance structures. At the heart of Indaya's legal framework is its commitment to ensuring the rights of individuals, enshrined in the Constitution of Indayan, which serves as the supreme law of the land. The Constitution not only safeguards fundamental rights but also emphasizes the Rule of Law, ensuring justice for all citizens, regardless of their socio-economic background.

One of the key regions in the southern part of the Country is Udpi, a State renowned for its serene landscapes, bustling towns and entrepreneurial spirit. Udpi, though peaceful and community-driven, is not immune to the challenges faced by other regions of Indaya. Its towns, like Kalyanpur, are known for their thriving business communities, where a sense of order and respect for the law prevails. However, even in such tranquil settings, the legal system is tested from time to time, as seen in the infamous Kalyanpur Murder Case.

In the peaceful town of Kalyanpur in the state of Udpi, life had always been predictable and orderly. Its residents, primarily businessmen and small shop owners, prided themselves on a sense of security and community. However, all of this changed dramatically in January 2020 with the high-profile murder of Ravi, one of the town's wealthiest and most influential citizen. Ravi had amassed a small fortune through his various ventures and was widely respected—though not without enemies in both his business and personal life. His brutal murder rocked Kalyanpur, leaving residents in fear and demanding justice.

Rajiv Kumar, a well-known entrepreneur who had crossed paths with Ravi on several occasions, soon found himself at the centre of this unfolding nightmare. Rajiv, a 32-year-old electronics shop owner, had built his business over the years with honesty and hard work. He was married to Meera Kumar and had two young children. Although Rajiv lived a modest life, his reputation for integrity made him a respected figure in Kalyanpur. But all of this was about to change when a neighbour, Ashok, claimed to have seen Rajiv near Ravi's residence just before the time of the murder. Based on this statement and flimsy circumstantial evidence, Rajiv's life would take a dramatic turn for the worse.

On a cold January evening, mere days after the murder, Rajiv was forcefully arrested by the local police. Inspector Rakesh, the officer in charge of the case, had been under immense pressure from local politicians and Ravi's family, who demanded quick and stringent action. They believed that an arrest was necessary to quell the growing unrest in the community, and Rajiv became the target of this pressure. Despite his repeated assertions of innocence, Rajiv was taken into custody and charged with murder and robbery. His arrest was the result of circumstantial evidence—Rajiv's fingerprints were found on the doorknob of Ravi's house, which Rajiv explained as being from a business visit earlier that week. The police, however, considered it a smoking gun.

Within hours, Rajiv's face was displayed across local news channels. The media wasted no time for raising their channel's TRP and sensationalizing the case, branding him a "cold-blooded murderer." News anchors debated his possible motive, speculating that greed had driven him to kill Ravi and steal his wealth. Social media lit up with hashtags like #JusticeForRavi, and Rajiv's family faced immediate ostracization from the community. His wife, Meera, was harassed, their children bullied, and the family shop lost all its customers overnight.

As the investigation progressed, it became clear that Rajiv was not the only person who could have had a motive to harm Ravi. Ravi's vast wealth and many business dealings had earned him enemies, some of whom were capable of such a crime. Yet, the police, eager to appease the public, focused solely on Rajiv. Witnesses who could have provided Rajiv with an alibi were ignored, and other leads were not pursued. The murder weapon, a knife found at the scene, bore no identifiable fingerprints, but the prosecution still pushed forward with its case, citing Rajiv's prior visits to Ravi's home as incriminating evidence.

Rajiv's lawyer, Neelam, fought tooth and nail to secure his release on bail, but the courts, rejected these pleas. Despite the evidence, the court argued that the seriousness of the charges warranted keeping Rajiv in custody. Months turned into years as Rajiv remained behind bars, awaiting his trial. His family's situation worsened—Meera struggled to make ends meet, taking up odd jobs to support her children, while Rajiv's mental health deteriorated in prison.

By 2023, Rajiv had been in custody for over three years. His trial had seen numerous delays, as the prosecution requested more time to investigate and gather evidence. Rajiv, now gaunt and weak from the stress of imprisonment, had almost lost hope. It was then that a breakthrough occurred. Neelam, relentless in her pursuit of justice, discovered new CCTV footage from a

nearby store that had gone unnoticed during the initial investigation. The footage clearly showed Rajiv leaving the area long before the murder took place.

Simultaneously, a new witness, Suman Joshi, came forward. She had seen two men entering Ravi's house on the day of the murder but had been too scared to speak out earlier due to local intimidation. The tide of the case began to turn as presented these findings in court.

At the same time, the real perpetrators, a gang led by Sandeep Thakur, were arrested for an unrelated robbery. During his interrogation, Sandeep confessed to having committed Ravi's murder after a botched robbery attempt. He detailed how his gang had broken into the house, intending to steal Ravi's valuables, but ended up killing him when he tried to resist. The confession exonerated Rajiv.

On May 10, 2023, the High Court of Udipi, convened for what was to be the final hearing in the case. The courtroom was packed—media representatives, local politicians and residents of Kalyanpur filled the seats, eager to witness the end of what had become a sensational trial. Neelam presented the new evidence with fervor, recounting the many failings of the police investigation and the wrongful incarceration of her client. She described how Rajiv had been a victim not only of a hasty arrest but of a system that had failed to protect his fundamental rights.

The confession of Sandeep Thakur was the final nail in the coffin. As the courtroom sat in stunned silence, the judge, visibly moved by the turn of events, addressed the assembly. He chastised the police for their failure to conduct a thorough investigation and highlighted the importance of protecting the rights of individuals even in cases where public sentiment calls for swift justice. Rajiv was acquitted of all charges.

Despite being declared innocent, Rajiv's ordeal was far from over. His release from prison was bittersweet—while he was a free man, his reputation and livelihood were in ruins. Rajiv's health had suffered irreparably, and his business was beyond saving. His children, once bright and full of promise, had withdrawn from society, scarred by the years of bullying and exclusion.

Rajiv, with Neelam by his side, decided to sue the police and the State for wrongful arrest and prolonged detention, invoking Article 21 of the Indaya Constitution, which guarantees the right to life and liberty. His legal team filed a writ petition before the Supreme Court of Indaya under Article 32 seeking compensation for the mental, financial, and social damage inflicted upon him and his family. They argued that the police's negligence and the court's repeated denial of bail had cost Rajiv three years of his life—years that could never be returned.

Issue Raised

1. Whether Rajiv Kumar's arrest was justified based on the weak circumstantial evidence presented against him. Could his fundamental rights have been violated due to the hasty actions of the police without substantial proof of guilt?
2. Was Rajiv's prolonged detention, extending over three years, a violation of his right to personal liberty? Could the judicial system have failed in protecting his rights by denying him bail repeatedly despite the lack of strong evidence?
3. Whether the police were negligent in their investigation by ignoring potential alibi witnesses and other leads, thus focusing only on Rajiv. Could this investigation had lacked the fairness and diligence expected, leading to the wrongful imprisonment of an innocent person?
4. Whether the media trial of Rajiv as guilty before the trial began affected his right to a fair trial. Did the media's coverage, pressure law enforcement and the judiciary into making biased decisions, thereby impacting the impartiality of the investigation and judicial process?
5. After being proven innocent, is Rajiv entitled to compensation for the damages—both personal and financial—caused by his wrongful incarceration? Should the State bear responsibility for the emotional and social suffering he and his family endured due to his wrongful detention?

NOTE:

- The laws of Indaya are pari-materia to the Laws of India, including the judgments delivered by the Supreme Court of India and the various High Courts of India.
- Indaya is also a signatory to all the conventions and treaties which India is signatory to.
- The participants are expected to bring to the court's attention to the relevant jurisprudence. It may include judgments and International instruments

- **‘Speaker’** refers to a participant who presents oral arguments in any given round.
- **‘Penalty’** refers to the deductions imposed on the memorandum scores of participating institutions/teams.
- **‘Participating Institution’** shall be presumed to be the institution of the participating teams.
- **‘Moot Problem’** means a set of facts published by the institution for moot court competition.
- **‘Rebuttals’** refer to those arguments /questions that the Complainant/Petitioner may raise at the end of the main pleadings of all the Orators.
- **‘Sur-rebuttal’** refers to the defence presented by the Respondent to the rebuttals

- ‘**Organizer**’ means Moot Court Society, Narayan School of Law
- ‘**Court Room**’ shall refer to the online platform in Preliminary round and Physical Court room made by Organizers or where the oral submission will be advanced.
- ‘**Scouting**’ means a person observing the Oral Rounds of a team other than the team such person is associated with.

➤ **ORAL ROUNDS OF COMPETITION**

➤ **General**

- The competition shall consist of Preliminary Round, Quarter-Final Round, Semi-Final Round, and the Final Round.

➤ **Preliminary Round**

- The rounds shall be conducted virtually by way of video-conferencing; the details of the platform will be given to the teams before the competition. The Meeting ID, Password, and Link will be communicated to the teams via email/WhatsApp.
- Each team shall argue once from the side allotted to them through the Draw of Lots, which shall be notified to the teams one day prior to the round.
- Each team shall strictly get a total time of 30 minutes to present their case. This time will include rebuttal and sur-rebuttal time [if permitted by the judge(s)]. The time distribution per speaker is left at the discretion of the teams subject to a minimum of 10 minutes per speaker and no more than 15 minutes per speaker. Rebuttals can be allocated a time of a maximum of 5 minutes.
- At the beginning of the preliminary rounds, the teams shall specify the time distribution for their rebuttals of each speaker to the moderator. The rebuttal round

proceeding shall be initiated once the moderator informs the team about the commencement of the time limit.

- Strict adherence to court manners shall be observed by all the participants.

➤ **Quarter-Final Round**

- The Quarter-Final Round will be held on the campus of Narayan School of Law, Gopal Narayan Singh University.
- The top 16 teams with the highest score in the Preliminary Rounds shall proceed to the Quarter-Finals. The match-up of teams in Quarter Final Rounds shall be determined on the basis of draw of lots.
- In case of a tie in scores calculated, the team with the higher score in the Written Submission (Memorials) shall proceed to this round.

➤ **Semi-Final Round**

- The Semi-Final Round will be held on the campus of Narayan School of Law, Gopal Narayan Singh University.
- The top 4 teams of the Quarter Final Rounds shall be declared for qualified for the Semi-Final Rounds. The match-up of the teams in Semi-Final Rounds shall be decided on the basis of the draw of lots.
- Each team shall get a total time of 40 minutes to argue, which will include rebuttal and sur-rebuttal time (if permitted by the judges). The division of time per speaker is left to the discretion of the teams.
- A time-extension for a maximum of 2 minutes may be granted to each team at the discretion of the Judge.

About 1st Deo Mangal Memorial National Moot Court Competition, 2022

The 1st Deo Mangal Memorial National Moot Court Competition 2022 has been successfully organised by the Moot Court Society, Narayan School of Law, Gopal Narayan Singh University, Jamuhar, Bihar. The Competition has been conceived with a dual objective, first to commemorate the extraordinary life of the Late Shri Deo Narayan Singh and Late Shrimati Mangala Devi who are the inspiration behind this university and secondly to celebrate the 5th foundation day of the Narayan School of law which falls on 7th October. With these objectives in mind, registrations were started from the Independence Day this year (15th Aug 2022). Moot Court Society received an overwhelming response from across the country so much so that it had to close down the registration process well before the last date, which was 30th September. 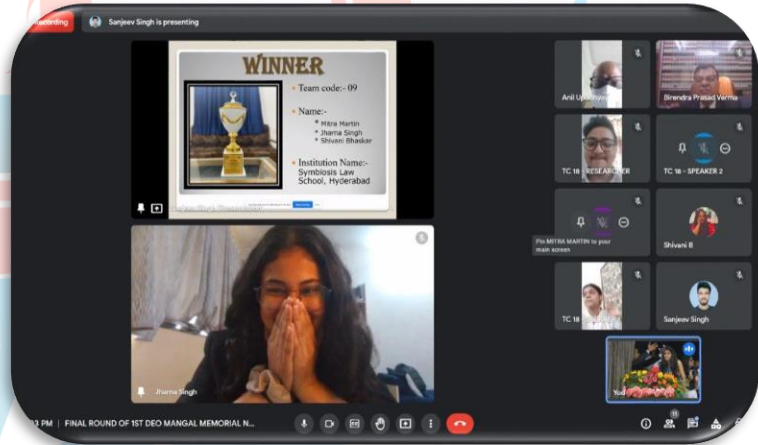
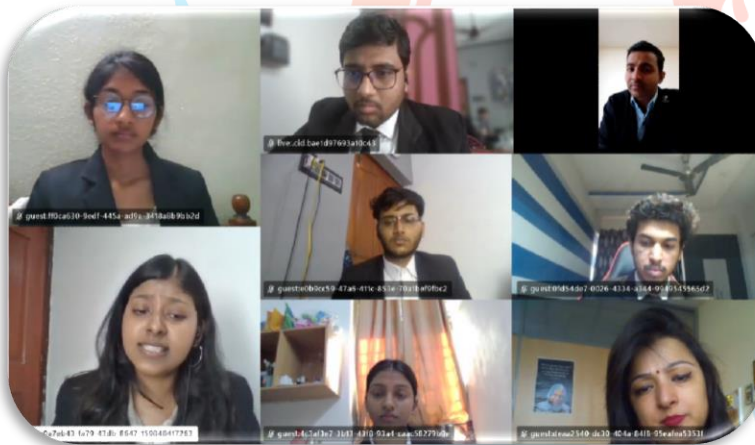
